Special Interest Day: It can now be confirmed that we will be holding another u3a Special Interest Day this September and are now accepting bookings. It is expected that interest will be high, so please don't delay booking your place. We will open bookings for u3a participants from the rest of the Bath and Wiltshire Network in a week or so. The theme of the day will be "The Future of the Media" and follows the success of the 2021 event on Climate Change and Sustainable Futures. The 2022 event has again been organised by u3a in Kennet jointly with Marlborough College on behalf of the u3a Bath and Wiltshire Network. It will be an all-day event on Monday 19th September 2022 at Marlborough College, Bath Road, Marlborough, Wiltshire, SN8 1PA.

The topic influences all age groups and we will be supported by experts in various fields of the media. We will explore how our media is developing and how it might look in 2040. Recognising that the media has changed significantly over the last 20 years, we will consider topics including:

U3a Day and 30th Anniversary of u3a in Kennet: As part of the 30th anniversary u3a Day this year will be Wednesday 14th September. By chance it sits nicely too with the 40th Anniversary of u3a in UK. There will be more about this next month. **Commemorative Tree Planting Update:** Linked to the above u3a in Kennet will plant a tree in 2022 to commemorate our 30th anniversary. The optimal time to plant trees is the autumn and plans are underway now with expert advice from the Marlborough Community Orchard. The tree will be planted in Jubilee Field, Manton behind the 'Oddfellows' public house where the Orchard has permission to plant another tree. We have chosen an old Wiltshire variety of apple tree known as 'Chorister Boy' which was developed initially in Salisbury and the purchase will be funded from our successful Special Interest Day on Climate Change in 2021. Planning for a short ceremony event associated with the tree planting will follow when the date has been confirmed. We of course already have a tree in the Marlborough Diamond Jubilee Plantation.



Group News

Aviation Group: The Group's last meeting was held at the Friends' Meeting House, Marlborough at 1pm on Wednesday, 13th July. They met first at the Parade Cinema next door at 12 noon for a drink and a bite to eat. Peter Morgan gave the presentation about the Schneider Trophy. Peter is a former Fellow of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers and Rolls Royce graduate apprentice. He is a lifelong aviation enthusiast.



In 1912, and just 9 years after the Wright brothers first 100 yard hop in a powered aircraft, Jacques Schneider – a wealthy French industrialist – announced a competition for seaplanes. His dream was to encourage development of reliable commercial aircraft using the world's seas as airports. He put up a cash prize and a magnificent art-deco style trophy that had to be won three times before it could be claimed in perpetuity. The first event in 1913 was a largely innocent yet glamorous affair around the bay in Monte Carlo, but after it was reinstated following the Great War, the Schneider Trophy would emerge as the most intensely serious air race of all time. Attracting huge public attention, the competition became a showcase of speed, with government backed teams chasing national prestige at any cost. The events became spectacular displays by the fastest men on earth, in the most futuristic and exciting machines ever conceived. At the final 1931 event, run on a course laid out in the Solent, it

was estimated a crowd of over one million watched Britain claim victory. But the winning 400mph+ Supermarine racer would give Britain a much greater and priceless legacy in future years. Its brilliant designer Reginald Mitchell would go on to design the Spitfire – an aircraft that still draws our eyes to the sky today – our senses lured skywards by the unmistakable roar of its Schneider inspired Rolls Royce Merlin.



Cycling Group: On the 18th June 2012 three u3a members, namely Allan Skipper, Brian Davies and Ann Yates (seen at the front of the picture), met in Hilliers Car Park, Marlborough. This was the first meeting of the Cycle group. They rode through Manton and Lockeridge and down Knap Hill to Woodborough Garden Centre then returned the same way. On the 27th June 2022 twenty members of the group, from a membership of over 30, met to commemorate this 10 year anniversary and celebration event. They rode the same route and once again

had refreshments at Woodborough Garden Centre. Over the last ten years there has been on average two rides every month, across Wiltshire, Berkshire and Oxfordshire. The growth of the group has led to a new pattern of a short ride of up to 25 miles or a longer ride of 25 to 35 miles. The one common feature is almost always a coffee and cake break! They are now on with the second Group Leader and another change has been the growth in the use of electric bikes. What will happen in the next 10 years? Info to follow!

There are recorders available for loan (from descant to bass) if you would like to try before you buy one (or two). Harriet can advise on which type of recorder to purchase: descant or treble, tenor or bass, plastic or wood, new or second hand. All music is provided.

She is available on Monday mornings, Tuesday and Friday mornings and afternoons and can accommodate up to 8 players at her home for a session. For a larger group, a hall would be required. She can offer flexible sessions to accommodate players of differing levels, including Beginners, Easy Ensemble, Intermediate Ensemble and Advanced Ensemble. A session would be of 90 minutes.
