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Music Maestros: When we started this group on 8 March 2022, we looked at early music. It takes place 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday afternoon each month. April was devoted to women Maestros, in May we looked at some specific musical instruments and in June we celebrated Her Majesty's long reign. July saw the creation of opera including a 'guest singer' and August tackled the rather heavy subject of musicology but then we considered two musical themes used by a number of composers other than the original. Our sessions include screen view and sound. So, six months into our novel group it is now time to look directly at Music Maestros



over the accepted musical periods. There were an increasing number of composers as time went by and the world 'got smaller', communication got larger and people moved about more. To identify any individual as a Maestro as opposed to a popular one is not easy. One might say that there were only few of the greatest Maestros but that is a matter for individual opinion.
