Annual General Meeting and Kennet u3a Talk: We will be holding our AGM on Wednesday 26th October at 2.15pm at the Kennet Valley Hall and on Zoom. It will be followed by a Kennet u3a Talk by Sibella Lang on the "Power behind the Veil". 'Do you drive? Go abroad alone? Work or party with men? Do your children live with you after a divorce? This lecture looks at the extraordinary drama unfolding in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia as women take up new positions in the social, cultural, economic and political life of the country of which they have been a passive sector for so many years. Sibella will map the historical context of the female position from the early days of the oil boom in the 1960's to the present day. She will consider different aspects of women's life and ask some urgent questions such as why, as the Kingdom opens its doors to the West, were 12 women academics, one of whom is a good friend of the lecturer detained without trial in Riyadh?'



Sibella Laing has lived and worked most of her married life in the Middle East, enabling her to develop an extensive understanding of, and love for, the history, peoples, and societies of that region. After a history degree at Cambridge University, she and her husband studied Arabic at the Middle East Centre for Arabic Studies in Lebanon. On arrival in Jeddah in 1973, she joined the British Council, after which in Riyadh 20 years later she became an English Language trainer, lecturer and public speaker. She is now a registered Guide for the Institute of Tourist Guiding, in French and Arabic as well as English. She has continued to be in touch with Saudi friends, including those now at odds with the new regime, and to return to the Gulf whenever possible.


