

Kennet u3a Talks: The next talk is on 9th February and will be given by Stuart Laing. The title is "The Messenger and the Minaret". Stuart Laing had a first career in the British Foreign Service, serving in Saudi Arabia and in Cairo, and then as Ambassador in Muscat and in Kuwait. He was Master of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, 2008 – 2018, and now researches and writes on Mediterranean, Arab and East African history. He is co–author of a book on Omani–British history, and has published a biography of Tippu Tip, the Arab–African ivory trader. Nationally and globally we face tension, sometimes conflict, as a result of failure of communication across religious and cultural divides. In recounting the early history of Islam, its rapid expansion out of



Arabia, its beliefs and practices, and its influence on society, art and communal life, Stuart Laing hopes to dispel some of the mystery about one of the world's principal religions.

Special Interest Day – The Future of the Media: We are pleased to confirm that we have agreed a new date with Marlborough College for our Special Interest Day on the Media which was postponed from September 2022 due to the death of her Majesty Queen Elizabeth. The new date will be Friday 28th April 2023 at the Memorial Hall at the College. The speakers who had agreed to join us last year are being contacted to check on their availability for the revised date and the programme for the day will be confirmed as soon as possible. We will send the final details to everyone who had booked in 2022 in order to confirm whether they are able to attend in April or would prefer to be reimbursed. 
Other News

Threads through Creation: Members visiting Bath may be interested to see the touring textile exhibition at Bath Abbey. 'Threads through Creation' is an art exhibition showing at Bath Abbey from 7th January to 19th March. It's a real treat for anyone in the applied arts, textile art and sewing. The show is touring twenty cathedrals, and consists of twelve beautiful silk panels re-imagining the story of Creation from the bible. The panels are huge – 2.7m high, from 1.5m to nearly 4m wide. It's one of the largest textile art projects by a single artist, ever. It took textile artist Jacqui Parkinson three years – and eight million stitches.
