# U3a in Kennet

#### **News Updates**

**General News:** Welcome to our fourth Newsletter of 2023. Spring is here now and along with the emerging flowers we have a full programme of u3a in Kennet events in the diary for April with our Kennet Talk on 19<sup>th</sup> at Kennet Valley Hall, our monthly Coffee Exchange session at the Town Hall on 27<sup>th</sup> and our Media Day at Marlborough College on 28<sup>th</sup>. Details of these events are included in this Newsletter and we look forward to seeing many of you at the sessions.

Media Day with Marlborough College: Our topical, thought-provoking and multi-generational event will be held on Friday 28th April 2023, from 9.30am to 4pm, at the College Memorial Hall. Our excellent speakers are all experienced journalists and media personnel working at national and local level. They will consider a wide range of issues about the media today and tomorrow including social media, 'truth' and democracy. New Members' Lunch: The next lunch will take place on the 5<sup>th</sup> May at Kennet Valley Hall. The invitations have now been issued and we look forward to seeing all those who have confirmed that they are coming.

The first lunch took place in March. It opened up at 10am and the

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forthcoming events. They were assured that new Executive Committee members are needed as retirements are an annual factor. At 1pm in an organised fashion diners from the two rows of tables collected their meals from two serving tables. This system eliminated unnecessary long queues. Much mingling took place between members and Group Leaders and a display of posters for the interest groups was set up on the stage. Thanks go to Alison Dewar who organised the RUG and liaised with the caterers. Also thanks were expressed to Dan Lefevre and Polly, our caterers who prepared, cooked and presented an enjoyable two course meal. The six Committee members present agreed that these caterers, as hoped, had given a good service and be asked to cover the second lunch on 5 May.

**Kennet u3a Talk:** The next talk is on 19<sup>th</sup> April at 2.15pm. The talk will be given by Commodore Ian Gibb MBE. It's called "From Sea Cadet to Commodore and beyond...". He will enlighten us with tales of his 43 years at sea with the P&O Company followed by 22 years as an Elder Brother of the Corporation of Trinity House. His vast knowledge covers the changing face of passenger vessels and their passengers from the early 1950s, culminating in his attaining command of the P&O flagship ORIANA on her entry into service in 1995, followed by an 'alteration of course' as a willing servant of Trinity House to ensure continued safety for the seafarer around the English and Welsh



coastlines. Ian is a fifth generation Master Mariner (on both sides of his family) who entered the School of Navigation, Warsash, in January 1954. Apprenticed to the P&O in 1954, he remained in their employ, gradually working up to Command of passenger liners in both P&O and Princess Fleets. His first 'brass hat' was in 1975 and his favourite ship was CANBERRA where he served on and off for 17 years. He is married and lives in Wiltshire, his hobbies include walking a pet beagle twice a day and raising money for the RNLI. He also writes for the magazine 'Shipping – Today and Yesterday'. It will prove to be a day not to be missed.

**Coffee Exchange**: The March event was given by the Wiltshire Wildlife Trust. It was the first session held upstairs in the Town Hall, giving a significant improvement in space for the 120 people who attended and in the quality of the presentation.

Over 60 years ago, the Wiltshire Wildlife Trust was established initially to protect butterflies in a wood. Now with 23,000 members, there are over 40 nature reserves covering wetland, woodland, meadows and chalk downlands protecting wildlife and natural habitats across the county. Anthony Atkinson, a Community




Engagement Officer at the Trust, spoke about the Trust's work in general and also particularly about the project at Bay Meadows, north of Marlborough beside the A346. Much of the work already achieved on the site has been undertaken by volunteers of all ages – from primary school children, all the way to several of our own members. #### **Group News**




