Sir Cliff Richard will receive around £2m towards his legal costs from the BBC after agreeing a final settlement following last year's privacy case.

In July 2018, the star $\underline{\text{won a High Court case against the broadcaster}}$ over its coverage of a police raid on his home.

The BBC was ordered to pay £210,000 in damages, and later agreed to pay £850,000 to cover legal costs. That figure has now increased.


