He is very well known as a former musical director at Marlborough College, an examiner for the Associated Board of Royal Schools of Music, a choral conductor and composer, and a lecturer on various subjects particularly on birds. With his wife Sally, he now runs musical appreciation courses at their home in Avebury.Robin gave us the benefit of his exhaustive musical knowledge when he chose his favourite musical pieces- just like Desert Island

Discs. These were presented visually with pictures and pieces of music score, and audibly playing on the keyboard and recordings of famous orchestras and singers of the various pieces. He described the background to his choices, the reason for his choosing them and the detail of the musical scores. His passion for music was clear throughout his fascinating talk. His choice of music included pieces by Brahms, Bach, Britten, Tchaikovsky, Stravinsky, Handel and Mozart but when questioned of all his pieces he had picked which, if he was only allowed one to take to the desert island, he chose the Last Songs of Strauss.

OBITUARY Michael Hart, 1st May 1928 – 30th October 2023



Michael was born in London to a German father and English mother. He moved with his family to Germany in 1931 and attended the French Lycée in Berlin. He was sent to a school (Gymnasium) in Bavaria to avoid attention as the holder of a British passport after the Nazis ordered all foreign passport holders to leave Germany. Eventually he fled west across Germany encountering an advancing American army group at night. When challenged he responded in English saying he held an English passport. They employed him as an interpreter and he worked for UNRA until 1946. His father then arranged for him to travel to England to complete his education after the war. After teaching and studying for 'A' levels Michael gained an Exhibition to Keble College, Oxford in 1948 after translating at the Nuremberg Trials too. His first teaching post was at Sherborne followed by a post as a House Master at Shrewsbury. Subsequent posts included an Inspector of Schools, and Headships at Mill Hill and the European Schools at Mol in Belgium and in Luxembourg. Michael was awarded the C.B.E. for services to education in Luxembourg towards the end of his time in that country. Subsequently he became an Advisor on education to the British Government. After moving to Marlborough in 2006 he encountered Sir John Sykes 1942 – 2020, who had been a student of his at Shrewsbury. Michael soon joined u3a in Kennet where he took on the leadership of the European and subsequently the English History Groups, Current Affairs and Advanced German language Groups.

Many u3a members have benefitted enormously from Michael's extensive knowledge, global perspective and enthusiasm for history. His natural skill and obvious enjoyment of teaching was admired and respected along with his candid, balanced and concise lectures. He remained an active member of the Groups until the autumn of 2023. His intellectual curiosity endured and he was researching AI and Chat CPT shortly before he died.

In addition to his role as a Group Leader Michael supported u3a in Kennet as a member of the Executive Committee. He was also an active contributor to the Marlborough Summer School, the Merchant's House lecture series and the Marlborough History Society. He will be sadly missed by his many friends and colleagues within u3a and the wider Marlborough community.
