Kennet u3a Talk, 14th February 2024

About 70 members met in the Kennet Valley Hall to hear 'A History of Punch and Judy' from Alix Booth on Wednesday 14th February. It sounded an interesting subject and, indeed, it was interesting. What was completely unexpected was that it was very amusing and, at times, downright hilarious. Alix told the story with slides, a video and using her glorious character puppets. She started in the early fifteenth century and took us through the centuries via country fairs, town markets, public hangings, and beach shows right up to the Covent Garden Puppet Festival now held annually in London. Punch, his wife Judy, the doctor, the policeman, the girl friend, the servant and the crocodile all made their appearances in small sketches throughout the afternoon. Tony Blair, Gordon Brown and Nicola Sturgeon made brief entrances when Alix illustrated how puppeteers in the past extended the classic stories in order to collect more



money from their audiences. Undoubtedly the star of the show was Samuel Pepys – in puppet form – who read from his diaries of 1662 about attending a performance of Italian puppets with his wife. Alix presented the whole history with a most entertaining script and her dexterity and her clever voices brought the subject to life. Click here for the video recording:

OBITUARIES

We were saddened to learn of the recent deaths of Stuart Hyde, AnnMarie Travis and Len Steet OBE.

Len Street, OBE 1926 - 2024 and former national u3a Chairman

Len was born in London and after leaving school at 16 years of age he became a laboratory assistant before joining the Navy in 1944, training to be a radar mechanic and subsequently taking a degree. Len's career was spent in education with posts including the principal of Stockton Billingham Technical College at 42 years being one of the youngest principals at that time. Subsequently he took the post of principal at Hertford Regional College. He was an active member and honorary officer of the Association of Principals of Education Colleges holding the post of its first general secretary from 1984 – 1990.

Beyond education Len led a full and active life with diverse interests including becoming president of the East Hertfordshire Opera Society. He was chairman and later president of the Nazeing Conservation Society and vice chairman of the Hertford Association of National Trust members and supported the Lea Valley Talking Newspaper for the Blind and the Hoddesdon Music Club.

Len became involved with u3a in 1992 when he was elected as chairman of the Steering Committee which led to the formation of Lea Valley u3a and later becoming chairman from 1992 – 1976. He Joined the u3a National Executive and he became the elected national chairman from

1997 – 2000 and oversaw important developments in the national educational support available to u3a members and groups including a regular educational bulletin ('Sources'), study group networks, study days, national summer schools, training for subject leaders and more recently online learning programmes written by third-agers for third-agers.



He instigated regular contacts with government about lifelong learning and a strategy for older people and succeeded in securing national recognition of the role of u3a in education. As a scientist, Len also began the u3a annual Royal Institution lecture, when some of Britain's most distinguished scientists talk about subjects of interest to u3a members.

Len received his OBE in 2003 being the first person to be awarded the honour for services to u3a. His important contribution was described in the books '500 Beacons: the u3a story' by Eric Midwinter: one of the founder members of u3a in our country and in 'The u3a story'. In 2012 Len began to explore approaches to the provision of in-depth study groups leading in 2014 to the launch of two in applied mathematics and early Christianity.

He moved to Marlborough in 2018, at the age of 92 after his wife died and joined his son Phil and



his daughter -in- law Sara. He took part in a couple of u3a in Kennet groups, and ran an opera appreciation group in his Canning Place apartment block. He was very active to the end of his life and gave his last opera talk only a few weeks before he died. He had recovered well following heart surgery but sadly became unwell and passed away on 29th January 2024 a few months before his 98th birthday.
