COFFEE EXCHANGE: THURSDAY 28TH MARCH 2024 AT THE TOWN HALL IN MARLBOROUGH

The morning was overcast, windy and damp when the Poetry Appreciation Groups gave their presentation in the Town Hall. Mary Caudell, who leads the groups, had put together a programme based on 'Spring and New Beginnings'.



The poems were introduced by those who had chosen them and who read them. This added an interesting dimension to the poems themselves. The pieces were wide ranging – Shakespeare, Browning, Hausman, Wordsworth and some modern pieces including an amusing piece by Charles Causley which brought a smile to the audience. There were two original poems presented by their author, Andrew Rae.

Surrounded by cherry blossom, daffodils, buttercups, snowdrops, lilies and bog myrtle, the Town Hall had burst into Spring, overcoming the gloomy weather outside. Many members may well have left the Town Hall and found their own favourite poems about spring. It was an inspiring morning and certainly lifted the spirits of the audience. KENNET u3a TALK, WEDNESDAY 10TH APRIL 2024, KENNET VALLEY HALL, LOCKERIDGE



The Wiltshire and Swindon History Centre houses the historical records of the area. They have various functions and this includes giving lectures. Their Heritage Services Manager, Terry Bracher, (photograph below) is fascinated by the curious and macabre and he came to give us his talk on medicine in Wiltshire over the centuries.



The talk was based on records that are held in the 8 miles of archives in Chippenham which cover 800 years. We heard a gripping story of disease, death, medical practice, accidents and cures. He presented us with original documents and told the story with great humour. We were subjected to some gruesome recipes for cures – including cooking parts of a cat – and we gained an understanding of the different attitudes to sickness and remedies in the past. The 90 or so members of the audience listened with much interest punctuated by

The Town Hall was busy for the Coffee Exchange on a sunny morning with over 70 members gathering for coffee and a chat. Mike Garner, one of our members came to present some of the escapes and adventures he has had over the last 90 or so years and how he has evaded death




on so many occasions. His career aloft was mostly as a loadmaster both in the RAF and then with several civilian companies. Parachutists, troops, ammunition followed by cattle, horses, camels, pigs, one day old chicks and every other sort of cargo was loaded into a wide variety of planes from the

old propeller engines through to modern jets.

The planes, the methods of loading and the cargoes changed but the basic skill of the loadmaster ensuring the correct weight and balance of the planes, remained crucial to the safety of the flights. He identified his days with the Sultan of Brunei's aircraft



as one of the best periods of his working life. His failure to qualify as a pilot as a young man, made Mike begin constructing his own light planes which he then flew and he is still pursuing this interest today.



Mike's enthusiasms and hobbies have certainly kept him healthy and active. 


CLIMATE CHANGE FILM
