COFFEE EXCHANGE 27th MARCH 2025.

NICOLA ABRAHAM, EDUCATION AND VISITS CO-ORDINATOR, THE MERCHANT HOUSE TRUST

One of her final engagements in her role brought Nicola to the Town Hall. She gave us a comprehensive history of the building. She described how, although the house was obviously badly damaged by the fire of 1653, there is much left in the structure to show that it was not totally destroyed. There is evidence of Tudor bricks and some of the fireplaces have medieval origins. . She led us through the history of the building and its occupants – the silk merchants, the printing works, the chemists, the post office and the booksellers ending its commercial times with WH Smith. She then talked us through the setting up of the Trust and its work and told us about events which take place at the house.

(Spoiler alert – the Christmas theme this year is to be *The Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens). Nicola talked with knowledge and passion and stressed how The Merchant House was a home of a member of “the middling sort”, a member of what we would now call the middle class and therefore is of particular interest as many of the houses which have survived from the Early Modern Times are those of the super rich and privileged. The London Transport Museum was a hit. One explorer downloaded a "circular statues tour" and followed the route. Self-guided tours of Wren's smaller churches in the City are also worth doing. Other reports were of exploring Bloomsbury and visiting St Paul's Cathedral. Juliet and I treated ourselves to tea in the Royal Opera House and a bit of people watching. He moved to Wootton Rivers with his wife, Fran, in 1986 and they have three children – Freddy, Madeleine and William.


