REPORT ON THE COFFEE EXCHANGE, 18th SEPTEMBER 2025

THE QUEST FOR WANSDYKE by ALAN SOLDAT.

Alan is a retired town planning consultant based in Wiltshire. He gives presentations and posts on YouTube channels on a wide range of subjects. He covers Anglo Saxon churches, music, architecture, archaeology and many and varied walks around the area.

At the Coffee Exchange in September he talked about the research he has undertaken into the Wansdyke. The Wansdyke is one of the greatest linear earth works in the south of England consisting of a ditch and a running embankment. What remains of the Wansdyke now is in two sections. One between Bristol and Bath and the longer part running from near Devizes to just south of Marlborough in the Savernake forest. These sections almost appear to be connected by 14 miles of Roman road.

Using diagrams, maps and photos, Alan talked us through the research that has been carried out over the last 300 or so years. He explained the theories that had been put forward as to when the Wansdyke was built, and who built it. He also explained the differing ideas as to why it was built. He reached some tentative conclusions which dated its building to the late or post Roman period and he feels that it was probably a boundary. The latest research techniques including Optical Stimulated Luminescence (which has only been used in the last few years) have contributed to these theories.

If anyone wants to see more of the extensive and fascinating details of the research, Alan has a book available from the Hobnob press and some of his slides are on his YouTube post 'The Quest for Wansdyke'.

MARLBOROUGH LITFEST PLUS WITH TONY ROBINSON: TUESDAY 21 OCTOBER 2025

Following the 2025 LitFest programme a special event with Sir Tony Robinson has been arranged for Tuesday 21st October 2025 at 7pm in Marlborough Town Hall.

Tony took the role of the iconic Baldrick in the *Blackadder* series and long-time presenter of *Time Team*, Robinson makes his fictional debut for adults with *The House of Wolf*: the first in a new historical series (*The House of Aethelwolf* series) spanning the Anglo- Saxons, Alfred the Great and the making of England. Published in September, this book is said to be perfect for fans of Ken Follett and Bernard Cornwell and has been praised by historian Dan Jones as 'A page-turner full historical intelligence, wit and heart'.

Tony is the author of over 30 children's books and several adult non-fiction books, including an autobiography, *No Cunning Plan*. An ambassador for the Alzheimer's Society since 2008, Robinson received a knighthood in the Queen's Birthday Honours 2013.

MARLBOROUGH COLLEGE INVITATION FOR U3A IN KENNET MEMBERS TO THE ANNUAL' 749 LECTURE'.

u3a in Kennet member David Du Croz will present the lecture on: 'The 749 - Stories behind the Names'. Wednesday 12th November at 7.30pm in the Memorial Hall at the College.

In this centenary year of the Memorial Hall, the lecture will explore some of the stories of duty and service behind the names of the 749 from the Marlburian community who dies in the First World War, and in whose memory and honour the Hall was built.

David was educated at Winchester College and read History at Trinity College, Cambridge. On retiring from his final job at Head of History at Marlborough in 2007 he became involved in helping to co-ordinate the College's commemoration of the centenary of the First World War, in the course of which he co-produced the film 'The 749' and co-wrote the book: "Marlborough College and the Great War in 100 Stories".
